# <u>Transferring the pattern and setting up</u> <a href="mailto:the-boop">the hoop</a>

1. Gather your materials (listed above).

2. Transfer the pattern to the material. My top tip for this is to stick the paper pattern on the window using some blu-tac and then put the fabric over the top (you could secure this with blu-tac too). Then use a fabric marker or pencil to trace it.






3. Put the fabric in the embroidery hoop. Make sure that it is centred and the hoop is tight. The fabric can often become slightly loose or slip during your embroidery, if it does, pull the edges of the fabric until the fabric inside the hoop is taught and tighten the screw at the top.

## **Stitch Guide**

#### **Satin Stitch**


- 1. Bring needle up at 1, down at 2, then back up right next to 1 and down right next to 2.
- 2. Place stitches closely together to fill in area.
- 3. Make sure the thread lays flat and without any twisting to produce a smooth look.

#### **Blanket Stitch**

- 1.Work from left to right.
- 2. Bring needle up at 1, down at 2 and up at 3, keeping the thread looped under the needle.
- 3. Pull thread through and shape stitch as desired.
- 4. Repeat multiple stitches until complete.

### **Lazy Daisy Stitch**

- 1. Come up at 1 and back down in the same hole or right next to point 1, forming a loop on the front side.
- 2. Bring needle up at 2 and pull thread to shape loop into desired shape. Pulling tighter creates a straighter looking stitch, while a looser thread creates a more rounded loop.
