## Amanda Jare Textiles

This quilt requires careful measuring and cutting but is relatively easy to assemble. Labelling the cut pieces as you go will help with assembly!

1 Wash, dry and iron all fabric and the wadding before making a quilt to avoid uneven shrinkage or colours bleeding in the future.

2 Before starting, use masking tape or a paper note on each piece to say how long it is (e.g. write ' 15 ' on a $151 / 2$ " strip). This will save time later.

3 Preparation for assembly It is worth taking the time, before stitching, to arrange the squares and strips you have cut, in order, for each row, by following the assembly diagram and rolling them softly together as shown in the photo right.


4 Label the first piece in a row (e.g. Row 21) using a small square of masking tape. This should stay on the fabric until the quilt top is finished.

5 Assembly Stitch together each row, following the instructions below and looking at the diagram on page two of this pattern. Join the pieces along their short sides with $1 / 4 "$ ( 6 mm ) seams.

The pieces for each row are listed by length, in order, left to right. Store the rows in groups of six (plus a final group of three) as indicated below and on the next two pages.


Row 1: A8 91/2" (24.1cm), B2 211/2" (21.6cm), A10 91/2" (24.1cm), C3 121/2" (31.7cm), C6 $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}(31.7 \mathrm{~cm})$, C3 $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}(24.1 \mathrm{~cm})$, C6 $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}(24.1 \mathrm{~cm})$, C3 31/2" ( 89 mm )

Row 2: A11 121/2" (31.7cm), B10 121/2" (31.7cm), A5 61/2" (16.5cm), B8 3½" (89mm), A9 31/2" (89mm), B3 181⁄2" (47cm), B15 311/2" (89mm), B3 121/2" (31.7cm), A3 31/2" (89mm), A10 12½" (31.7cm),
