



archer scarf & shawl

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Gradients transition along a long arrow shape for a fun scarf or dramatic wrap. Two ombré colourways are worked in a simple intarsia pattern. Tassels dangle from each of the corners.

Sizes

Scarf (Shawl)

Finished Measurements

Scarf: 12 x 67" / 30 x 170 cm

Shawl: 21 x 85" / 53.5 x 216 cm

Materials

Freia Fine Handpainted *Ombré Fingering Shawl Ball*; 430 yd (395 m) per 100 g ball; 100% Merino Wool

430 (860) yd / 395 (790) m each MC and CC

Shown in: Coho and Cochinilla

Needles & Notions

4.5 mm (US 7) needles

Stitch marker

Digital scale (optional)

Yarn needle

Gauge

21 sts and 42 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Garter Stitch, blocked.

Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.



Finishing

Block to schematic measurements. Weave in ends.

Sew tassels to each of the 3 points as follows.

Scarf: Sew MC tassel to CC point on cast on edge. Sew CC tassel to MC point on cast on edge. Sew remaining tassel to tip of arrow on bound off edge.

Shawl: Sew 2 MC tassels to the points on cast on edge. Sew CC tassel to top of arrow on bound off edge.

Abbreviations and Stitch Glossary

- CC** Contrasting colour
- k2tog** Knit two sts together—1 st decreased
- kfb** Knit into the front and back of the same st—1 st increased
- MC** Main colour
- p** Purl
- RS** Right side or public side of the work
- st(s)** Stitch / stitches
- WS** Wrong side of the work
- yo** Yarnover
