

# Vanilla Frappuccino

Dots Dabbles

(Dated: v1.2 – July 16, 2020)

Vanilla Frappuccino is a unisex sock pattern. This sock was designed to serve as nearly mindless tv knitting, with 2 small cable patterns to keep things interesting. It is knit cuff down with a traditional heel flap and gusset, and should be well suited for both novice and seasoned sock knitters alike.

**Yarn:** About 70-90 grams of fingering weight sock yarn

Yarn used in sample is Schachenmayr Regia Pairfect (75% wool 25% nylon, 459 yards or 420 meters per 100 grams) in Wood.

**Gauge:** 8 stitches and 11 rows is 1 inch or 2.5 cm in stockinette stitch

**Needles:** 2.25 mm (US 1) or size needed to obtain gauge in stockinette stitch

**Materials needed:** Needles for working small circumferences in the round, a cable needle if you use one for cabling, at least 1 stitch marker, and a tapestry needle

**Techniques used:** Cables, Bavarian twisted stitches, and kitchener stitch

**Size:** Small (56 stitches), Medium (64 stitches) and Large (72 stitches) to fit a leg circumference of about 8 (9, 10) inches or 20 (22.5, 25) cm



## Abbreviations:

<i>K</i>	Knit
<i>Ktbl</i>	Knit through back loop
<i>P</i>	Purl
<i>Sl</i>	Slip stitch (as if to purl)
<i>Wyib</i>	With yarn in back of work
<i>Wyif</i>	With yarn in front of work
<i>K2tog</i>	Knit 2 stitches together
<i>SSK</i>	Slip slip knit
<i>P2tog</i>	Purl 2 stitches together
<i>BOR</i>	Beginning of round
<i>1/1TLPC</i>	Sl1 to CN at front, p1, ktbl1 from CN
<i>1/1TRPC</i>	Sl1 to CN at back, ktbl1, p1 from CN
<i>1/2TRC</i>	Sl1 to CN at back, ktbl2, ktbl1 from CN
<i>1/2TRPC</i>	Sl1 to CN at back, ktbl2, p1 from CN
<i>2/1TLC</i>	Sl2 to CN at front, ktbl1, ktbl2 from CN
<i>2/1TLPC</i>	Sl2 to CN at front, p1, ktbl2 from CN

Please read before you start:

- When more than one number is given, the first applies to size Small, the second to Medium, and the third one to Large
- Both charts and full written instructions of the charts are included in the pattern. See pages 3 to 4

## I. CUFF

Using the German twisted cast on, cast on 56 (64, 72) stitches and join for working in the round. Place BOR marker.

Start working chart A for a total of 14 rows.

### Note about reading the charts:

For Small: work the stitches with no colour  
For Medium: work yellow & stitches with no colour  
For Large: work the yellow, orange & stitches with no colour

**Please pay attention to the description of the cables!** Within the cable panels, all the knit stitches are worked through the back loop, even though the symbol might suggest otherwise
