

Dementor

Dots Dabbles

(Dated: v1.1 – July 16, 2020)

Dementor is a unisex sock pattern featuring cables and texture. It is knit cuff down with a slipped stitch heel flap and round heel. The pattern name was inspired by the ghastly demen-tors from the Harry Potter books because the colourway of the original sample reminded me of them.

Yarn: 80-100 grams of fingering weight sock yarn

Yarn used in sample is Lana Grossa Meilenweit Late Night (75% wool 25% nylon, 219 yards or 200 meters per 100 grams) in colourway dark grey (2909)

Gauge: 8 stitches and 11 rows is 1 inches or 2.5 cm in stockinette stitch

Needles: 2.25 mm (US 1) or size needed to obtain gauge in stockinette stitch

Materials needed: Needles for working small circumferences in the round, at least 3 stitch markers, and a tapestry needle

Techniques used: Reading charts, working cables, and kitchener stitch

Size: Small (64 stitches), Medium (72 stitches) and Large (80 stitches) to fit a leg circumference of about 8 (9, 10) inches or 20 (22.5, 25) cm



Please read before you start:

- When more than one number is given, the first applies to size Small, the second to Medium, and the third one to Large
- In the instructions, it is assumed that you will be knitting these socks using the Magic Loop method. However, it is also possible to work these stitches on DPNs, 9" circular needles, or any other method for working small circumferences in the round. Just make sure to place stitch markers so that you know which stitches are on needle 1 and 2 as per pattern
- If you would like to knit mirrored socks, simply reverse the cable crossings of 3/3RC and 3/3LC in

chart C, D and E for the second sock

Abbreviations:

<i>BOR</i>	Beginning of round
<i>CN</i>	Cable needle
<i>K</i>	Knit
<i>K2tog</i>	Knit 2 stitches together
<i>Ktbl</i>	Knit through back loop
<i>P</i>	Purl
<i>P2tog</i>	Purl 2 stitches together
<i>Sl</i>	Slip stitch (as if to purl)
<i>Ssk</i>	Sl1 k-wise, sl1 k-wise, place back on LHN, ktbl
<i>St(s)</i>	Stitch(es)
<i>Wyib</i>	With yarn in back of work
<i>Wyif</i>	With yarn in front of work
<i>3/3LC</i>	Sl3 to CN at front, k3, k3 from CN
<i>3/3RC</i>	Sl3 to CN at back, k3, k3 from CN
<i>1/3RPC</i>	Sl1 to CN at back, k3, p1 from CN
<i>3/1LPC</i>	Sl3 to CN at front, p1, k3 from CN
<i>1/3RC</i>	Sl1 to CN at back, k3, k1 from CN
<i>3/1LC</i>	Sl3 to CN at front, k1, k3 from CN

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Using the German twisted cast-on, cast on 64 (72, 80) stitches and join for working in the round. Place BOR marker.
