

# Jumpsuit for dolls

## PDF crochet pattern



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## Foreword

The pattern includes step-by-step illustrated instructions how to crochet jumpsuits in many variations: short or long sleeves, mini-midi-maxi trousers lengths. You can create a very big collection for your doll using this pattern. You can crochet this jumpsuit with cotton or any other yarn. As well uni or with different colors crocheting this jumpsuit looks grateful any way!

You crochet the jumpsuit from the top down in one piece. There is no need to sew, accept the buttons and decoration if you wish.

Skill level: Easy to Intermediate

This jumpsuit is actually easy to make, but you should have already crocheted several projects before you start with this.

You will need to crochet following easy stitches: chain stitch, single crochet, double crochet, slip stitch. You should also can crochet 2 DC together.

The list of contents helps you to jump in any step of instructions without scrolling all over the pattern (just click the point needed).

I always try to make my patterns as perfect as possible.

However please let me know if anything is unclear or if you encounter any mistakes.

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## Materials needed:

- Cotton yarn 125 m / 50 grams (100% cotton) or any other yarn with the same yardage
- Crochet hook size 2.5 or 2.75 to have the gauge (see further down)
- Small buttons (about 7-8 cm) or pins
- Optional: beads, decorative buttons, satin ribbons

## Abbreviations:

CH - chain

DC - double crochet

SLST - slip stitch

## Notes

(please read all notes before you start and if something is not clear in the following instructions, please check these notes again)

- You will make the jumpsuit in one piece first in rows, starting with the neck and then in rounds, making the trousers legs.
- Each row or round starts with chain 2 (counts as 1<sup>st</sup> double crochet). Further on in the instructions these 2 chains are not mentioned separately (e.g. if you read at the beginning of the row "Crochet 7 DC", it means "Chain 2 counts as 1<sup>st</sup> double crochet, and 6 double crochet").
- By crocheting in rounds, each round always ends with a slip stitch, to join the beginning and end of round.
- Do not forget to turn at the end of the row.
- V-group: make 1 double crochet + chain 1 + 1 double crochet in the same stitch. (you can also make 3DC-cluster without holes: crochet 3 DC in the Row 1 and in the following rows you will always make 3 DC in the middle DC of the 3DC-cluster of the previous row.
- To change yarn color in rows, work last double crochet as follows: yarn over with old color, insert hook in the next (usually last) stitch of previous row, yarn over, pull the hook through the chain, yarn over, pull through first 2 loops on hook, and now yarn over with new color and draw through last 2 loops on hook.
- To change yarn color in rounds, work last double crochet of round with old color, then working joining slip stitch as follows: insert hook in first double crochet of round (in highest chain of chain 2 count as 1<sup>st</sup> double crochet), yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete joining slip stitch.
- If it is not mentioned separately, it means that 1 stitch (e.g. 1 double crochet) is worked in the following stitch. If you read "10 DC", it means you should make 1 double crochet in each of the following 10 stitches.
- (=N) – the number of stitches in the row or round in total
- Increase the next stitch – it means work 2 DC in the next same stitch
- Decrease - it means crochet 2 DC together.

## Gauge

with crochet hook size 2.5 cm (1 inch) and yarn 125 metres / 50 grams:

22 DC = 10 cm (about 3,94 inch)

Change hook size if necessary, to obtain gauge.

## Beginning. Rows 1-5



Crochet CH 50.

Row 1: 7 DC, V-group, 10 DC, V-group, 12 DC, V-group, 10 DC, V-group, 7 DC.



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
