

Doll dress "Diagonal" PDF Crochet pattern



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Foreword

The pattern includes step-by-step illustrated instructions how to crochet doll dress with asymmetric pattern for 18-inch dolls. You can create a very extended collection for your doll using this pattern and different colors of yarn. This dress looks fantastic any way!

You crochet the dress from the top down in one piece. There is no need to sew.

You can crochet this dress with socks wool or any other yarn your choice. You can also use your rest stash yarn.

Skill level: ♥ ♥ ♥ ♥ ♥

Intermediate. You will need to crochet following stitches: chain stitch, single crochet, double crochet, slip stitch.

Language: English (US terms).

The list of contents helps you to jump in any step of instructions without scrolling all over the pattern (just click the point needed).

I always try to make my patterns as perfect as possible.

Materials needed

- Yarn 210 metres / 50 grams, e.g. sock wool (approx. 55-60 grams)
- Crochet hook size 1.75 cm

Gauge

With crochet hook size 1.75 and wool 210m/50gr:

30 double crochet = about 4 inches (approx. 10 cm)

Change hook size if necessary, to obtain gauge.

Finished measurements

The dress fits 18-inch dolls.

Notes

(please read all notes before you start and if something is not clear in the instructions, please check these notes again)

- Each row or round starts with chain 2 (counts as 1st double crochet). Further on in the instructions these 2 chains are not mentioned separately (e.g. if you read at the beginning of the row "Crochet 7 DC", it means "Chain 2 counts as 1st double crochet, and 6 double crochet").
- Do not forget to turn at the end of the row. It is not mentioned separately.
- By crocheting in rounds, each round always ends with a slip stitch, to join the beginning and end of round.
- If it is not mentioned separately, it means that 1 stitch (e.g. 1 double crochet) is worked in the following stitch. If you read "10 DC", it means you should make 1 double crochet in each of the following 10 stitches.
- To change yarn color in rows, work last double crochet as follows: yarn over with old color, insert hook in the next (usually last) stitch of previous row, yarn over, pull the hook through the chain, yarn over, pull through first 2 loops on hook, and now yarn over with new color and draw through last 2 loops on hook.
- To change yarn color in rounds, work last double crochet of round with old color, then working joining slip stitch as follows: insert hook in first double crochet of round (in highest chain of chain 2 count as 1st double crochet), yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete joining slip stitch.
- * * - repeat between * and *
- [...] – the group of chains to repeat
- Increase - you make 2 chains (e.g. 2 DC) in the next same stitch
- DC3tog = 3 DC together decrease –
 - 1) Yarn over, insert hook into the next stitch of pre-row. Yarn over hook and draw yarn through the 1st loop on hook (=3 loops on hook). Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (=2 loops on hook).
 - 2) Yarn over, insert hook into the same stitch of pre-row. Yarn over and draw through 1st loop on hook. Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (=3 loops on hook).
 - 3) Yarn over. Insert hook into the same stitch in pre-round. Yarn over and draw through the 1st loop on hook (=5 loops on hook). Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (=4 loops on hook). Yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

Abbreviations

CH – chain

DC – double crochet

SC – single crochet

SLST – slip stitch

DC3tog – 3 DC together decrease

The beginning. Row 1

Row 1 - Color 1: crochet CH 14.



Work 1 DC into the 6th chain from hook,
CH 1, skip 1 stitch, 1 DC - repeat 4 times, turn.
