## CYNTHIA PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Cynthia is an oversized loose fit blouse. The back yoke is lined and forms part of the front panels. There's an inverted box pleat at the back. This blouse has a classic collar with stand and a center front placket with buttonholes. It features a dropped shoulder and a long sleeve, which has pleats and a slit at the bottom and is finished with a buttoned cuff. The slit is finished with a tower placket. The hem is uneven, being higher at the front and longer at the back. The length of this blouse is mid-thigh.

#### FABRIC RECOMMENDATIONS

To make this blouse choose shirting or dress weight fabrics with the following properties:

- · Medium weight, with good drape, breathable, soft, non-stretch or with very little stretch, opaque
- The fiber content can include natural fibers (wool, silk, cotton, linen), artificial (viscose), blends (Tencel + cotton, cotton + polyester, cotton + viscose, etc) and synthetic (polyester, polyester + elastane)
- The following fabrics are recommended: shirting, dress weight cotton, linen, poplin, lightweight denim, cupro, viscose, modal, babycord

**Attention!** We do not recommend stretchy knit materials and lightweight sheer fabrics (chiffon, organza, stretch lace).

The blouse on the photo is made with shirting fabric. This fabric is medium weight, soft, has good drape and a very little stretch. The fiber content is 100% cotton.

#### PATTERN PIECES LIST

#### 1. From the main fabric:

- Front cut 2
- Back cut 1 on fold
- Back yoke cut 2
- Sleeve cut 2
- Collar stand cut 2
- Collar cut 2
- Cuff cut 2
- · Sleeve tower placket cut 2

2. Interfacing:

- Cuff cut 2
- Collar cut 2
- · Collar stand cut 2
- Sleeve tower placket cut 2

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern marks and notches to your fabric.

You will also need to cut 2 interfacing strips 7.5cm wide for stabilizing button placket areas of the front pieces. Check your printed pattern pieces to determine the length of the strips. Make sure that strips are cut on the grain (along the selvedge edge of the interfacing material).

### **SEAM ALLOWANCE**

1cm seam allowances are included in your pattern.



On the wrong side of the front piece turn in 1cm of the placket seam allowance and press.



Then make a further fold 3.5cm wide on to the wrong side and press.



Turn lower edge of front placket to outside along fold line, keeping bottom edges even. Stitch 1cm above the raw hem edge.
