RECOMMENDATION

• for baby bibs •

- I usually use an inner fabric such as white or ivory woven cotton fabric, but for a higher absorption, you can use terry cloth fabric, fleece, flannelette;
- I normally choose a more colorful print for the front side of the bib and a pale color or a simple print for the backside. The small prints are perfect for these bibs; the most suitable fabrics for these are: cotton, poplin, or linen;
- Wash and air dry the fabrics before working with them to avoid shrinking.

PATTERN PRINT INSTRUCTION

- You can easily print it at home, using A4 or US letter size paper
- Check the printer settings, to make sure you are printing at 100% scale
- To check if the patter was printed correctly, measure the square on the patter to have 1 cm / 0.39" sides.

The seam allowance is included in the pattern, and is represented by a dotted line







If you have another type of lace trim, you can sew it like this:



You can sew a straight lace, without wrinkling it:

- You have to decide how much of the lace trim you want to see on the final product after you turn the bib on the other side
- Make some notches along with the lace trim, that will help the lace be flatter and well-positioned in places where the seam is curved
- Pin the lace trim on the edge of the bib, making sure that the notched edge of the lace is at the same level as the edge of the bib.
